

LASIK is an eye surgery that corrects nearsightedness, farsightedness and astigmatism—all of which are often caused by a focusing errors that can be corrected by changing the shape of the cornea. (A cornea can be too steep causing nearsightedness, too flat causing farsightedness or football-shaped causing astigmatism.)

To reshape the cornea, a LASIK surgeon creates a protective flap of tissue in the outer layer of cornea and uses a laser to remove microscopic cells in the layer beneath. After just a few minutes, the surgeon is done and puts the flap back in place, which acts like a bandage as the patient's eyes heal. In the months following LASIK eye surgery, the patient sees with improved vision.

## Where did LASIK originate?

LASIK has an accidental history, like that of penicillin. IBM researchers working with a new type of laser in the 1980s realized they could carve animal tissue without damaging the tissue. Eye researchers further developed the use of this laser in the '80s and '90s to the point they could safely use the laser's unique non-tissue-harming trait to reshape corneas. Across the globe, eye doctors improved on each other's work, until LASIK was born.

What is LASIK today? It's the world's most common elective surgical procedure.




#### **LASIK Price**
